The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, November 25, 2008 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the Office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Vice Chairman, Kent Wilcox declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Vice Chairman made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the north wall and that pamphlets are available. Present: Vice-Chairman, Kent Wilcox, County Board Members, Linda Thomsen, Jeff Quist, Daryl Miller, Ernest Abariotes and Marvin Rohwer. Duane Wilcox absent. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen.

It was moved by Miller and seconded by Quist that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the Nov 10, 2008 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Kent Wilcox abstained. Motion carried.

Clerk discussed a Resolution to transfer money from Building Fund to Bond Funds #2501 & #3000 until levied taxes are collected, as the principal and interest payments are due December 1. Clerk read Resolution. Motion by Abariotes and second by Rohwer to adopt Resolution 2008-46. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried.

**RESOLUTION 2008 - 46**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, NEBRASKA:**

WHEREAS, the Washington County Board of Supervisors agree that funds in the amount of \$22,500.00 should be transferred from the Washington County Building Fund #4050 to the Washington County Public Safety Communication Bond Fund #2501 in the amount of \$16,500.00 and to the Washington County Courthouse Bond Fund #3000 in the amount of \$6,000.00, until levied taxes are collected. Additionally, these monies are to be repaid to the Washington County Building Fund #4050 within the current budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby directed to transfer funds in the amount of \$22,500 from the Washington County Building Fund #4050 to the Washington County Public Safety Communication Bond Fund #2501 in the amount of \$16,500.00 and to the Washington County Courthouse Bond Fund #3000 in the amount of \$6,000 until levied taxes are collected. Once levied taxes are collected, these monies are to be repaid to the Washington County Building Fund within the current budget year.

Cheryl Parsons, Road Dept, discussed the Nebr Dept of Roads' inspection of Wash Co bridges. The NDOR closed 2 bridges this week. So far, three bridges have been closed and weight restrictions have been placed on several more. Parsons had asked Darren Brown, Schemmers, to discuss this situation with the Board. Brown stated Wash Co is not alone with having bridge problems, many counties nationwide are closing bridges. The Board's job is to answer the public on why can I drive a grain truck across this bridge one day and have it closed the next. Brown said the way bridges are designed and inspected today is different than it was a year ago, which is consequently why all these deficiencies are showing up now. These old steel bridges the County has are referred to as fracture critical, meaning if one member of the bridge fails, the whole bridge fails. Bridges today are built with many girders on them, if one breaks, they won't fall down, whereas truss bridges have two supports, if one breaks the whole thing comes down. Federal regulations are also requiring bridges to be inspected for tension and compression on the connections, the gusset plates. This is why these 2 latest bridges are being closed. Brown discussed two factors causing stress on the plates: increased loads, these old bridges weren't designed for the heavy loads we have today and the second factor is metal fatigue, meaning metal will bounce back when it is stressed, but over time, it reaches a point when it breaks. Brown discussed repairing or replacing the gusset plates and placing weight restrictions on some bridges. The Board thanked Brown for his comments.

Parsons asked to have a committee of 3 Board members to meet with Julie Ogden to review proposals which will be received regarding repair work of Bridge #C89-31920 over New York Creek and also look into other bridge problems. Motion by Quist and second by Miller to appoint Duane Wilcox, Jeff Quist and Linda Thomsen to the Bridge Committee. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence had been received: DOR-Sept Lodging Tax=\$1,145.41, letters from Jack Andersen, Pamela Lancaster and Steve Morrill running for an office on the NACO Board and Homestead Exemption Summary Certificate from Co Treas. Motion by Miller and second by Quist to receive correspondence and place on file. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Harriet Waite, with the Blair Area Chamber of Commerce, had, at the Board's request, prepared a list of prospective members for the Tourist Lodging Tax Committee. Harriet Waite and Laura Shaner were willing to stay on the committee. New members suggested were Mary Alice Johnson, Donna Latwaitis- owner of Motel California and Linda Combs. Motion by Miller and second by Quist to reappoint Harriet Waite and Laura Shaner and appoint Mary Alice Johnson, Donna Latwaitis and Linda Combs to the Tourist Lodging Tax Committee. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Phil Brazelton came before the Board to discuss various contracts regarding equipment and maintenance for the Communication Center. The Motorola Service Agreement is a yearly contract for software subscription and technical support, at a cost of \$50,260. Motion by Quist and second by Thomsen to authorize Vice Chairman to sign Motorola Service Agreement. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried. Brazelton had a revised contract with Sprint/Nextel regarding the rebanding. Brazelton had talked to the Dep Co Atty about this. The revision was in regard to increasing the amount of money the County is being reimbursed. Motion by Quist and second by Miller to authorize Vice Chairman to sign Sprint Nextel Contract. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried. Next, Brazelton discussed the GEO-Comm Contract for Phase 2 Mapping Maintenance.

Geo Comm. is the mapping contractor for the Phase Two wireless 911 maintenance. GEO Comm requests funding through the Public Service Comm to pay for software upgrades. We don't pay anything locally but they need our authorization to get the funding. Motion by Quist and second by Abariotes to approve contract with GEO Comm. and authorize Phil Brazelton to sign contract. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried. The contract with Nine One One is the annual software maintenance contract for the 911 equipment. The Deputy County Attorney reviewed the contract. The cost of the contract is \$5,533. Motion by Miller and second by Quist to authorize the Vice-Chairman to sign contract. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried.

County Assessor had no items for the Board of Equalization. Board recessed for lunch.

At 1:00, motion was made by Abariotes and seconded by Rohwer to open a public hearing on Industrial Tracts: Tax Lot 17 Sec 8-18-12 & Tax Lots 280 & 281 Sec 7-18-12, owned by Foodliner, Inc. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried. Phil Green, Assistant City Administrator for Blair, reviewed the Board's action on undeveloped lots at the May 20, 2008 meeting. Green cited Statute 13-1121, which says if the lot has had no improvements in seven year's time, the County Board shall remove the designation of Industrial area. Rick Boehm, Foodliner Terminal Manager, stated Foodliner bought the property 2½ years ago but they are going forward with plans for a \$10,000,000 warehouse. Boehm gave the Board information on the warehouse plans, but no actual construction has been started. Dep Co Atty Talbot discussed Statute 13-1121 as it applies to this property. Motion by Quist second by Thomsen to close the public hearing. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried. Motion by Miller and second by Quist to remove the Industrial Tract Designation on Tax Lot 17 Sec 8-18-12 & Tax Lots 280 & 281 Sec 7-18-12. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Quist, Kent Wilcox, Miller, Abariotes and Rohwer. Nay: None. Motion carried.
