The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 23, 2009 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the Office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman, Duane Wilcox declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Chairman made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairman, Duane Wilcox, County Board Members, Linda Thomsen, Kent Clausen, Mary Alice Johnson, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Absent: Jeff Quist. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen.

Corrections to the June 9th minutes were discussed: Abariotes stated he voted no in the following paragraph "The Building and Grounds Committee said with the variances in the bids for the office remodel, they asked Cook to go through the bids and get back to the County Board. Motion Hineline second Johnson to table this item to the June 23rd meeting. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Quist, Wilcox, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nays: None. Motion carried." Vote should have read "Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Quist, Wilcox, Johnson and Hineline. Nay: Abariotes." Also, the Schemmer and Assoc representative's name was stated as David Brown but his name is Darren Brown. Johnson said she had gotten an e-mail regarding the newspaper minutes being different than the official minutes. Clerk stated according to statute, it is permissible to publish a brief statement of the proceedings in the paper and not the full official minutes. Pam Daly spoke of the Open Meeting Act and of the problems she saw with the newspaper minutes. It was moved by Abariotes and seconded by Clausen that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the June 9, 2009 meeting be approved, with the aforementioned corrections, but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. The following correspondence had been received: Nebr Dept of Rev-April Lodging Tax \$1034.23 and MAPA Beltway Feasibility Study Meeting. Board discussed attending the Beltway Feasibility meeting. Motion Abariotes and second by Clausen to receive correspondence and place on file. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Wilcox, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Quist absent. Motion carried. Pam Daly and Dennis McCormick spoke about the newspaper minutes.

Clerk explained a recommendation from the State Auditor to eliminate separate funds not required by statute and incorporate them into the General Fund. Clerk read Resolution 2009- 27 to put Relief and Medical Fund, State Institutions Fund, Stop Program, Juvenile Intake Program and Computer Fund as office budgets in the General Fund and transfer money in said funds to the General Fund. Hineline made a motion to refer this to the budget committee. Motion died for lack of a second. Motion Clausen second Thomsen to adopt Resolution 2009-27. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Wilcox, Johnson and Abariotes. Nay: Hineline. Quist absent. Motion carried.
