February 23, 2010 Minutes Washington County Board of Supervisors Supervisor's Room Courthouse Blair, Nebraska 68008

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, February 23, 2010 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the Office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman, Duane Wilcox declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting was being recorded. Chairman made note that the Open Meetings Law was posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairman, Duane Wilcox, County Board Members, Linda Thomsen, Kent Clausen, Jeff Quist, Mary Alice Johnson, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen.

It was moved by Clausen and seconded by Quist that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the February 9, 2010 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Quist, Wilcox, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence had been received: Dept of Rev December lodging tax is \$894.38. Motion Quist and second by Clausen to receive correspondence and place on file. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Quist, Wilcox, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Cheryl Parsons, Road Superintendent, had an engineering agreement for road improvement between Washington County and JEO Consulting for Project #C89-515, which is the intersection of CR 39 & CR 28. Julie Ogden, JEO, stated she would first like to do a study in this location to help define the best way to address the issues. Ogden went over the traffic count results and discussed changes to a deep ditch, which is a tributary so will need a Corp Permit. Estimated cost for study is \$6,150, estimated cost for design is \$18,395, minus \$3120 if survey could be done soon. William Burdess, who owns property at this intersection, also gave his suggestions for improving the intersection. Motion Hineline second Clausen to approve a study and preliminary design agreement with JEO engineering for the intersection of CR39 & CR28, with a clause to opt out of the design agreement if the County chooses. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Quist, Wilcox, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Julie Ogden, JEO, gave an update on Federal Aid projects. Changes have been made to the LPA (Local Public Agencies) Guidelines Manual for Federal Aid Projects. This means we will have to take a couple steps backward on all current federal aid projects. Ogden will go back through whatever environmental clearances NDOR got on these projects when they were first programmed and they will have to be redone. The procedures manual was rewritten last May and is undergoing another major rewrite. Ogden went over Washington County's data on the State's Surface Transportation Program information sheet handout to the Board.

At 10:00 Parsons discussed the hearing for the 1 & 6 Year Road Plan for 2010 that was held February 18. The 1&6 was clearly presented at the meeting on a well done power point. Parsons read the Resolution. Motion Quist second Clausen to adopt Resolution 2010-2 Washington County's 1&6 Year Plan. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Quist, Wilcox, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, that the One-Year Plan and Two-Six Year Road Plan for Road Improvements for Washington County, Nebraska as presented by the County Board of Supervisors at a Public Hearing on Thursday, February 18, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. and more particularly described on NBCS FORM 8 as being part of the "One-Year Plan" and NBCS FORM 9 as being part of the "Six-Year Plan," all shown on the enclosed map and made a part thereof, be and are hereby approved and adopted.

Clerk had received a request from Dakota County for Washington County to write a letter of support for LB 955, the Correctional Facility Reimbursement Act. Chairman Wilcox sent a letter to Senator Giese as the hearing occurred before the Board meeting date. Clerk read the letter.

Mary Alice Johnson had contacted several counties about their county burial costs and handed out copies of the information received.

Sheriff Mike Robinson did a power point presentation to answer questions pertaining to the Sheriff's Department raised by William Burdess. Burdess had expressed concern over the rising costs for the County's law enforcement and had questioned the practice of allowing deputies to take cruisers home. Robinson discussed the structure of the Sheriff's department and reviewed studies done by other agencies as to the cost effectiveness of the assigned vehicle program. Robinson checked with other Counties and found they allow road patrol deputies to take vehicles home. Robinson talked about the time saved by officers having their equipment in the cars and being able to respond to emergencies from their home. Robinson also stated maintenance costs are lower on the vehicles. Robinson had stats from surrounding County Sheriff's Departments comparing wages, number of personnel, crime and calls for service. Robinson discussed the take home vehicle program and the current labor contract. Robinson answered questions by the Board and stated assigned vehicles save the county money. Burdess had further questions on the vehicle program benefit.

Chairman requested adding an emergency item to the agenda. Road Superintendent Parsons needs to fill a vacancy and wanted Board members to help interview applicants. Motion Hineline second Thomsen to add: "Ask for Board members to assist interviewing applicants for Road Dept" to the agenda as an emergency item. Vote- Aye: Thomsen, Clausen, Quist, Wilcox, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Thomsen, Clausen and Quist volunteered to help interview applicants on March 3.

At 11:33 the Board convened as Board of Equalization, see separate minutes. Board adjourned from BOE at 11:40 and reconvened in regular session.

Dennis McCormick and Paul Cerio discussed the problems they see with the County's website. Board recessed for lunch.

Doug Cook, Planning & Zoning Administrator brought the following items before the Board. Gordon Anderson with the City of Omaha and Ben Rogge were also present.
