January 25, 2011 Minutes Washington County Board of Supervisors Supervisor's Room Courthouse Blair, Nebraska 68008

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, January 25, 2011 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the Office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman, Mary Alice Johnson declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting was being recorded. Chairman made note that the Open Meetings Law was posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairman, Mary Alice Johnson, County Board Members, Steven Kruger, Kent Clausen, Jeff Quist, Jerry Kruse, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen.

Quist moved, seconded by Kruger that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the January 11, 2011 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence had been received: Check for \$2,070.00 from the Papio-Missouri River NRD 6 new hookups on the Wash Co Rural Water line, information about the NACO Institute of Excellence and an Email from Paula Hazelwood saying Novozymes will be hiring approx 90 employees. Abariotes moved, seconded by Hineline, to receive correspondence and place on file. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Board drew numbers for a seating arrangement. Name order as it appears on the electronic vote board is: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline.

Cheryl Parsons, Road Supt., had Julie Ogden, JEO, present a re-cap of all the bridge and box culvert projects that JEO has under design for the County. Ogden gave the Board information and went over the projects, cost, funding source and status. Board discussed the projects.

Next, Parsons went over some projects discussed at the Road Committee meeting concerning the Union Pacific Railroad. 1. Road Committee recommended Union Pacific Railroad and the land owner have further negotiations regarding the CR28/29 railroad crossing. Abariotes motioned, Hineline seconded, to table the CR 28/29 RR crossing and acquisition of property. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Kruse abstained. Nay: None. Motion carried.

- 2. Road Committee recommended the railroad crossing at the Marshall-Nursery Road, which is County Road 15, be redesigned. Kruger motioned, seconded by Hineline to request UP RR redesign railroad crossing at County Road 15. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Kruse abstained. Nay: None. Motion carried.
- 3. Road Committee recommended not constructing a cul-de-sac off of CR32, west of Kennard, on Brandt property. Committee asked Parsons to work with the land owner to have an area where the motorgrader can turn around. Also, no parking signs will be posted. Abariotes moved, seconded by Hineline, to approve Road Comm recommendation to not construct a cul-de-sac off of CR32 on Brandt property. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Kruse abstained. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Mike Smith, Weed Superintendent, gave the Board copies of his year end report. As several reports were included, Board requested tabling this to allow them time to read through it. Quist moved, seconded by Clausen to table the Weed Dept year end report until February 8th. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Parsons and the Board set Tuesday, February 15th, 7:00, in the multi-purpose room at the Courthouse, as the date for the One & Six Year Road Plan public hearing. Date was later changed to Thursday, Feb. 17th, at 7:00 due to a scheduling conflict. Parsons gave the Board an update of various equipment problems.

Sheriff Mike Robinson and Randy Wildman discussed the need for improvements to the Jail kitchen. Robinson stated there were two options: they could just replace the countertops and cupboards as needed or they could hire an architect and enlarge the kitchen. When the jail was built the capacity was 17, now the capacity is 32. Board decided to go look at the kitchen. Hineline motioned, seconded by Quist to table this and refer it to the Bldg & Grounds Comm. Dennis McCormick commented. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Johnson read an email from Shaun Melotz requesting a letter of support from the Board on LB 487. Melotz stated she believes this bill is intended to clarify LB 160, the Papio NRD's "bonding bill". This bill strikes the word "exclusive" from the zoning jurisdiction language of LB 160. Clerk sent the Board a copy of the proposed letter of support. Clausen motioned, seconded by Quist to authorize Chairman to sign a letter of support from the Board on LB 487. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Board had previously approved a three year Juvenile Justice Grant for the County Attorney's Office. This is the third year of the grant. Each year, Board needs to sign the grant papers. Motion Quist second Clausen to

authorize Chairman to sign grant papers. Vote- Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. As Talbot was in Court and unable to attend the meeting, Board will ask him to go over figures at the next meeting.

Doug Cameron addressed the Board on a topic he referred to as County Court fraud update. Cameron gave the Board information regarding a court case he has been involved with. Cameron read a letter then asked the Board to exercise a panel of 2 County Supervisors to do an investigation so as to help resolve this issue. Johnson stated it was her understanding since this is in Court proceedings, the Board had no jurisdiction. Cameron thanked the Board.

At 11:30 AM the Board convened as Board of Equalization, see separate minutes. Board adjourned from BOE at 11:35 AM and reconvened in regular session.

Wes Ehlers, Sequoia Consulting Group, discussed the company and gave the Board a proposal for preparing indirect cost allocation plans for the County. County is currently using Maximus, Inc for this service. Abariotes motioned, seconded by Hineline to table this item and refer contracts to Co Attorney's office. Vote-Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

There were no comments from the public. At 11:45 Board recessed to go look at the Jail kitchen. Board reconvened at 12:20. Abariotes, Chairman of Bldg & Grounds committee, will contact an architect.

Claims were received and reviewed, following which it was moved by Quist and seconded by Kruger that the following claims be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Vote-Aye: Kruger, Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruse, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.
