The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 14, 2011 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairperson, Mary Alice Johnson, declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Chairperson made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairperson, Mary Alice Johnson, County Board Members, Kent Clausen, Jerry Kruse, Jeff Quist, Steve Kruger, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen and County Attorney Shurie Graeve.

It was moved by Quist and seconded by Kruger that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the May 24, 2011 meeting and minutes of the emergency meetings May 27, 2011, June 2, 2011 and June 3, 2011 be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Quist and seconded by Clausen that the regular monthly fee reports of the following officials be received and placed on file: Co Clerk \$332.25, Reg of Deeds \$16,969.25, Co Court \$23,013.06, Co Plan Dept \$10,448.00, Clk Dist Crt \$1,264.50, Sheriff \$2,457.00 and Road Dept \$2,338.51. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Cheryl Parsons, Road Superintendent, had the following road matters for the Board:

The Corps of Engineers has decided our National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) company, Felsburg-Holt & Ullevig, needed to do a wetlands delineation, at additional costs, on Federal Aid Project BRO-7089(23) Blair West. Julie Ogden, JEO Consulting Group, discussed the project. Clausen motioned, seconded by Kruger to approve spending the extra \$3,946.14 on the Federal-aid project. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Quist motioned, seconded by Clausen to approve the Supplemental Engineering Services Agreement No 1 Resolution 2011-25. Vote-Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Parsons said several changes in the motorgrader specifications were discussed at the last Road Committee meeting. Kruger motioned, seconded by Hineline to amend the specs to add a Tier 3 machine, if available. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: Kruse. Motion carried. Kruger motioned, seconded by Clausen to approve the motorgrader specifications with the amendments. Rick Maslowsky, Road Dept foreman discussed the specs and the trade-ins. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Road Dept will receive bids for two new motor graders.

Ogden gave the Board handouts on the Marshall Nursery County Road 38 Project C89 (531) culvert and stated the preliminary design was completed and submitted to Dick Sklenar, with the Papio-Missouri River Natural Resources District for their review. The County is applying for a grant from the NRD for this project. Sklenar had a hand out for the Board and stated the whole point of their road structure program is to incorporate some soil conservation features into the project. Ogden went over the project changes the NRD was requiring. Board discussed doing the project without the NRD grant but determined they would still be money ahead doing the changes for the grant. Quist motioned, seconded by Clausen to continue the NRD grant program and approve the revisions required by the NRD. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger and Abariotes. Nay: Hineline. Motion carried.

Many Township Officers were present for setting the Township rates for the maintenance of roads for Fiscal Year 2011-2012. Parsons went through the current contract and stated the cost per mile is \$1,440.00. Board discussed the problem of staying under the levy limit if the cost is raised. Quist motioned, seconded by Kruger to leave the road maintenance rates at \$1,440.00 per mile. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: Johnson. Motion carried.

Greg Drew addressed the Board on the behalf of his client, Faith Stevenson, regarding her concerns on the access road for Co Road P30 on her property. Board discussed the concerns raised. Chairman asked that this agenda item be reconsidered at a later date when details were worked out.

Kip Kissinger, United Healthcare, gave the Board information on the County's claims for the year.

Abariotes left the meeting at 10:33 A.M.

Chairman gave an update on the flooding and Board discussed road conditions and road closings in the County. Chairman stated the Washington County Emergency Executive Sub-Committee has been meeting and took emergency action to grant a temporary easement to Martin Marietta Materials, Inc. Graeve discussed the easement and the hold harmless clause for the County. Kruger stressed the importance of keeping track of expenses involved with flooding.

Bill Pook, Region 5/6 Civil Defense, and Susan Winkler, American Red Cross gave an update on the Red Cross shelter at the Fort Calhoun High School. Red Cross shelters are designed to meet immediate short term sheltering needs. Pook said this flooding will be a sustained event and many of these displaced people have to keep paying their mortgages/rent for the homes they were forced to leave and for these people there is basically no federal or state aid available. Red Cross provides mostly short term solutions. Johnson had contacted the State about our General Assistance Program but the minimum income

requirement would disqualify many people. Johnson said Blair City was working to provide longer term temporary housing and the City would like the County's support on this project. Phil Green, Assistant City Administrator for Blair City, discussed the City's agreement to use Dana College Holling's Hall for people displaced by flooding. Green said there are 14 families (42 people) paying \$150 per month for housing in this facility and they have received 12 more applications for housing. This housing arrangement is on a month to month basis. Green gave the Board a sheet outlining the preliminary budget for expenses to provide this flood relief housing. The college is asking for a monthly \$5000 lease. The City would like to split the cost with the County. Jon Stewart, Blair City-Council President, spoke of the advantages to provide housing for people who work in Blair to lessen the impact the flood is causing on local businesses. Kruse motioned, seconded by Clausen to approve paying \$2,500 per month, through December. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson and Kruger. Abariotes absent. Hineline abstained. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Rob Bellamy, Sheriff's Office employee and president of the FOP, discussed the negotiations of the FOP contract and requested the Board sign an addendum extending the FOP Contract for 1 year or less. Board discussed the fact the contract stays in place whether or not an extension is signed. Hineline motioned, seconded by Kruse, to not approve an addendum extending the FOP contract. Vote- Aye: Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger and Hineline. Nay: Clausen. Abariotes absent. Motion carried.

The following correspondence had been received: DOR Lodging tax for Mar \$1,419.92; PK Mfg sold and the county has received a check for \$22,285.38, which was the amount remaining on their loan in the Revolving Loan Fund; Best Care Emp Assistance Program Third Quarter Report; Information from NACO about LB 589, which changed the procedure for the temporary use of the state highway system for special events and a letter from Gateway thanking Board for their support. It was moved by Quist and seconded by Kruger that the correspondence be received and placed on file. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger and Hineline. Abariotes absent. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Kruse motioned, seconded by Clausen to adopt Resolution 2011- 26, which amends Resolution 2010-38, to leave the \$21,000 transferred to the Road Reconstruction Bond Fund in that fund. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger and Hineline. Abariotes absent. Nay: None. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION 2011 - 26

Many roads have limited access due to flooding but in order to assist people who want to go their property, the Sheriff's office will control access by issuing passes. Graeve and Robinson went over some of the details. Clausen motioned, seconded by Quist to add the flood matter of controlled access passes as an emergency item to the agenda. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Motion by Quist, seconded by Clausen to accept the pass policies and procedures as set forth by the Sheriff's Office and the County Attorney's office. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

At 12:45 PM, motion was made by Clausen and seconded by Quist to enter into closed session. Chairman stated the reason for the closed session was to discuss personnel matters, the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual. At 1:35 PM, motion by Clausen and second by Quist to end closed session. Chairman again stated the reason for the closed session was to discuss personnel matters, the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual.
