

**July 12, 2011 Minutes
Washington County Board of Supervisors
Supervisor's Room Courthouse
Blair, Nebraska 68008**

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, July 12, 2011 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairperson, Mary Alice Johnson, declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Chairperson made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairperson, Mary Alice Johnson, County Board Members, Kent Clausen, Jerry Kruse, Jeff Quist, Steve Kruger, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hinline. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen and County Attorney Shurie Graeve.

Motion Kruse second Clausen to approve the agenda for July 12th. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion carried. It was moved by Abariotes and seconded by Kruse that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the June 28, 2011 meeting and minutes of the budget workshop meetings July 6 and July 7, 2011 be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Abariotes that the regular monthly fee reports of the following officials be received and placed on file: Co Clerk \$289.23, Reg of Deeds \$19,010.75, Co Court \$17,413.38, Co Plan Dept \$16,920.00, Clk Dist Crt \$3,161.98, Sheriff \$2,973.32 and Road Dept \$294,138.61. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence has been received: Nebr Surface Transportation Program Book, quarterly loss report from NIRMA and we received word that Congressman Fortenberry will visit Blair. It was moved by Abariotes and seconded by Kruger that the correspondence be received and placed on file. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Sheriff Mike Robinson and Deputy Tom Lamb, Sheriff's Office representative for emergency management, requested the Board's approval to apply for the 2010 Homeland Security buffer zone protection plan that covers the Terra Nitrogen Chemical plant. The formula used for the threat assessment of the plant's vulnerability, strength and weaknesses, resulted in a grant award in the amount of \$194,000. This will be used to purchase a mobile camera system for the command post and eight accompanying laptops. Grant also covers a marine radio for the boat and other radio equipment. Buffer zone grants are primarily meant for the protection of a critical infrastructure but the equipment can also be used for any emergency that may arise in the county. Board discussed the equipment to be purchased and training to use the system. Hinline made a motion to defer a decision on this until the next Board meeting. Motion died for lack of a second. Clausen motioned, seconded by Quist to approve the BZPP grant. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Kruger and Abariotes. Nay: Johnson and Hinline. Motion carried.

Cheryl Parsons, Road Supt, said motor grader bids were discussed at the Road Committee meeting but no recommendation was agreed on. Parsons stated she thought it was important that 2 motor graders be purchased. Hinline made a motion to purchase a 2011 JD. Motion died for lack of a second. Quist motioned, seconded by Kruse, to purchase a 2011 John Deere 770 GP Tier 4 grader for \$228,955, with a trade in of 2003 JD grader \$53,462 for a cost of \$175,493; and purchase a 2011 Caterpillar 140 M Tier 3 grader for \$254,786, with a trade in of 1996 Caterpillar grader for \$66,500 for a cost of \$188,286. Graders to be paid for by \$225,000 in Road budget and the rest financed. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson and Kruger. Nay: Abariotes and Hinline. Motion carried. The tabulation sheet for the six grader bids and trade-ins can be obtained at the Clerk's office.

Mike Blackley, Union Pacific Railroad, reviewed the plans for the railroad crossing on County Road 28. The RR is putting a double line in and the Board approved the plans presented by UP for changes to this crossing. UP has been negotiating for 8 months with a land owner regarding a temporary construction easement, which is needed to proceed with the work at this intersection. Presently, a temporary injunction has been filed in County Court. Blackley said he was here to petition the County to eliminate the grade railroad crossing on County Road 28 and the first step in this process is to direct the Road Supt to prepare a road study. Board discussed the project. Motion Clausen second Quist to adopt Resolution 2011- 30 requesting a road study on CR28. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Kruse abstained. Nay: None. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-30

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

WHEREAS, The Washington County Board of Supervisors has received a "Petition" from Union Pacific Railroad requesting the abandonment or vacation of a portion of County Road No. 28 which crosses Union Pacific right-of-way, resulting in the closure to the public of the County Road 28 railroad grade crossing, and a said parcel of land located in sections 27, 28, 33 & 34, all in Township 18 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M. Washington County, Nebraska and more particularly described by the attached Exhibit "A".

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. 38-1722 (1943) as amended, it is necessary to adopt a resolution directing the County Road Superintendent to prepare a road study regarding hereinafter described, and to submit her recommendation as to the abandonment or vacation of portion of County Road No. 28 which crosses Union Pacific right-of-way, resulting in the closure to the public of the County Road 28 railroad grade crossing, and a said parcel of land located in sections 27, 28, 33 & 34, all in Township 18 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M. Washington County, Nebraska and more particularly described by the attached Exhibit "A".

NOW, THEREFOE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Road Superintendent prepare a road study regarding abandonment or vacation of portion of County Road No. 28, which crosses Union Pacific right-of-way, resulting in the closure to the public of the County Road 28 railroad grade crossing, and a said parcel of land located in sections 27, 28, 33 & 34, all in Township 18 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M. Washington County, Nebraska and more particularly described by the attached Exhibit "A".

The Fairboard asked PVPA if they would like to sell food at the event for a fundraiser and PVPA agreed to do this. Clerk read resolution. Motion Kruse second Clausen to adopt Resolution 2011-31. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION 2011 - 31

WHEREAS, Papio Valley Preservation Association, has filed an application for a Special Liquor Permit to dispense alcoholic beverages at the Washington County Fairgrounds, Arlington, Nebraska:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Washington County, Nebraska, Board of Supervisors hereby approves the application of Papio Valley Preservation Association, and grants permission to use the specific area designated in said application on August 20, 2011, for the hours of 6:30 PM to 12:30 PM for the purpose of dispensing of the alcoholic beverages on said premises; provided however, applicant or its agents shall not enter the premises or dispense alcohol until a Release and Hold Harmless Agreement is executed and delivered in form satisfactory to Washington County and a Certificate of Insurance is on file with the Washington County Clerk showing that Applicants have a commercial general liability insurance policy with limit of liability not less than \$1 Million of combined single limit per occurrence and showing

Washington County, Nebraska, as an additional insured.

During budget discussions, Board had requested Mike Smith, Weed Superintendent, check on prices to repair the County's truck. Hine line motioned, seconded by Abariotes to approve having the repairs done at Country Tire. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hine line. Nay: None. Motion carried. Dennis McCormick made a comment.

Susie Paulsen, Clk District Court, discussed the annual agreement with Nebraska Health & Human Services to account for the work relating to child support enforcement and provide a mechanism to figure reimbursement for the County. Motion Kruse second Kruger to approve annual agreement with NHHS. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hine line. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Graeve had given the Board a copy of the Child Support Enforcement Contract with Stephen Kraviec, placing the responsibility for child support enforcement duties with an attorney other than the County Attorney. Kraviec will receive \$36,000 per year, with mailing costs, filing fees and sheriffs fees up to \$5,000. Motion Clausen second Quist to approve the Child Support Enforcement Contract with Stephen Kraviec. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hine line. Nay None. Motion carried.

Roger Gilliland and Adam Snoozy, Control Services, discussed the maintenance contract for HVAC equipment for the Courthouse with the Board. Board decided to go with 188 hours under contract at a cost of \$17,070.00. Clausen motioned, seconded by Kruse to approve maintenance contract with Control Services for \$17,070.00. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hine line. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Board had asked Attorney Alan Wood, legal counsel for the Nebraska Association of Fair Managers, to research the ownership of the fairgrounds. Board received his opinion that the County has legal authority to convey ownership of the fairgrounds to the Ag Society. Motion Quist second Abariotes to authorize Chairman to sign the Quitclaim Deed transferring ownership of the Washington County Fairgrounds to the Washington County Agricultural Society. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Abariotes and Hine line. As past president of the Ag Society, Kruger abstained. Nay: None. Motion carried.

There were no items for the Board of Equalization at 11:30.

At 11:45, motion was made by Clausen and seconded by Kruger to enter into closed session. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hine line. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman stated the reason for the closed session was to discuss a Sheriff's Office personnel matter, the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual and the protection of public interest with respect to discussion regarding labor negotiations - Sheriff's Office. At 12:10, motion was made by Kruger and seconded by Johnson to end closed session. Chairman again stated the reason for the closed session was to discuss a personnel matter, the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual and the protection of public interest with respect to discussion regarding labor negotiations - Sheriff's Office. No action was taken.

Public comment was heard from Dennis McCormick.

Claims were received and reviewed, following which it was moved by Kruger and seconded by Hine line that the following claims be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hine line. Nay: None. Motion carried.
