December 27, 2011 Minutes Washington County Board of Supervisors Supervisor's Room Courthouse Blair, Nebraska 68008

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, December 27, 2011 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairperson, Mary Alice Johnson declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting was being recorded. Chairperson made note that the Open Meetings Law was posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairperson, Mary Alice Johnson, County Board Members, Kent Clausen, Jerry Kruse, Jeff Quist, Steven Kruger, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen and Deputy County Attorney Ed Talbot. Chairperson Johnson said there was no Board of Equalization today.

Motion Kruse second Clausen to approve the agenda for December 27, 2011. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Minutes from the Dec 13th meeting were corrected (as shown in italics) to delete a sentence and add the Board's vote. Delete: *The Flood Emergency Subcommittee met and recommended not participating in the buyout program.* Board discussed the liability involved in the buyout program. Kruger moved, seconded by Hineline to not participate in the County buyout program. Add the vote: *Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.* It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Quist that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the December 13, 2011 meeting be approved, with aforementioned corrections, but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence had been received: Dept. of Rev. Lodging Tax remitted for Oct \$1,638.40, a letter from Darrell Logeman regarding negotiations with the FOP, the County received a recommitment dividend from NIRMA in the amount of \$1,344, and two departments received funds from the NIRMA ASSIST program. Road Dept will receive up to \$793.68 to help purchase a rolling ladder, welding helmet, first aid kits, face shields, bench grinder and safety glasses. The Extension Office will receive up to \$500 toward purchasing an AED and related equipment. Motion Abariotes and second Clausen to receive correspondence and place on file. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Jesse Gonzalez, Building Maintenance Superintendent, gave an update on the problem of water leaking into the offices. After inspecting the area, it was determined the metal flashing on two peaks of the Courthouse is separating and the water is coming in there. McKinnis Roofing said they could fix the flashing for \$800 per peak. Gonzalez told the Board after this is fixed, there are four areas that will need the tuckpointing repaired. Gonzalez also said he had DryHero – Disaster Restoration Systems Inc, come test for mold in the offices affected by water damage and that no mold was detected.

Cheryl Parsons, Road Superintendent, went over the traffic sign retroreflectivity policy given to Board members. NIRMA drafted this policy, assisted by County Road Supts, to help counties be in compliance with the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) federal guidelines for signs. Parsons stated they are meeting the requirements in the program which call for keeping a sign inventory, performing yearly inspections of signs, conducting retroreflectivity inspections and regularly maintaining signs. Board discussed the policy and asked that the Dep Co Atty read through this final copy. Motion Kruse second Clausen to adopt the Traffic Sign Retroreflectivity Maintenance Program – Calendar Year 2012, pending the Dep Co Atty's approval. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Parsons gave a flood update and said they are through with the flood repairs for now, but still have repairs to the armor coat and asphalt, which will be done at a later date. In other road matters, Parsons said she was meeting JEO this afternoon to check the completion of the bridge on CR 20. Board discussed various road projects.

John Christensen told the Board he owns a house that received flood damage east of Ft Calhoun and would like to get a building permit to repair the house. Chairperson had Barb Brazelton, from the Planning and Zoning Dept come to the meeting. Christensen handed the Board a copy of the Substantial Damage Estimator report he received from the County. Christensen

disputed the findings on the SDE which said the structure was 87.2% damaged. Christensen got an estimate for \$13,860, from N&H Builders, to make repairs to the home, which would be less than 50% damage. Talbot asked Brazelton if she knew specifics about the appeal process with FEMA. Brazelton said FEMA would come and reevaluate the SDE that Doug Cook and Don Boswell did. Clausen stated he did not want to see the land being bought by a government entity and taken off the tax rolls. Brazelton said this property is in the floodway on the current FEMA maps and as previously discussed, property in the floodway is not eligible for a building permit. Board discussed issuing conditional building permits to people who may be affected by the Jan 6th date. Robbin Jeffrey spoke.

Clerk read Resolution 2011-52 which would adopt the new FEMA flood maps. Karen Jensen and John Christensen spoke. Board generally agreed they do not like the new flood maps but as Hineline pointed out failing to adopt this would have far reaching consequences. Hineline moved, seconded by Abariotes to adopt Resolution 2011-52. Vote- Aye: Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: Clausen and Kruse. Motion carried.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE FLOOD INSURANCE STUDY (FIS) AND FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAPS (FIRM) AS PREPARED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY'S FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) EFFECTIVE JANUARY 6, 2012.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Regional Office has prepared a new Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) for Washington County Nebraska effective January 6, 2012,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY, NEBRASKA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

That Washington County, Nebraska hereby adopts the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) as prepared by FEMA to be effective January 6, 2012.

Deputy Co Atty Talbot had reviewed Resolution 2009-55 which was discussed at the Dec 13th meeting and wanted to clarify first of all, that even though this Resolution was signed by 2 Board members no longer on the Board this doesn't in any way affect the validity of the resolution. Talbot read through the resolution saying it states elected officials shall receive an annual salary increase and increases shall be based on the consumer price index, midwest region. Pam Daly, Robbin Jeffrey, Dennis McCormick, William Burdess and Merry Truhlsen spoke. Board discussed the Resolution and the CPI.

Veterans Service Officer, Dennis Cordle, had a memorandum of understanding for VetraSpec for the Board's approval. VetrSpec is a web based application the Nebr Dept of Veteran Affairs has purchased and is using for veteran claims management. Cordle said this will be a valuable tool for correspondence and for processing claims. Clausen moved, seconded by Abariotes to approve the MOU for VetraSpec at an annual cost of \$399.00. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Tom Lamb, Sheriff's Office, told the Board their department received two items from the Planning, Exercise & Training (PET)/Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) group. These items were purchased with left over money in PET/UASI budgets. From 2008 grant money, platform robot camera was purchased, at a value of \$29,089, and from 2009 grant money, one time use chemical suits for officers responding to hazardous incidents were purchased, at a cost of \$5,290.50. Lamb discussed the uses for the robot and the chemical suits. While the City of Omaha distributed this equipment to the County at no cost, Lamb had agreements regarding this property for the Board to sign. Motion Quist second Clausen to authorize Chairman sign the Property Transfer Agreements for the Regional PET/UASI Program. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Board gave a brief review of the following committees: ENHSA, Papio NRD, Region 5/6 Emergency Management, MAPA, Gateway Development, NE Nebraska Juvenile Detention, County Visitor's Promotion, Public Health District Advisory Board and I-80 Corridor.

At 10:13, motion was made by Clausen and seconded by Quist to enter into closed session. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman stated the reason for the closed session was to protect the public interest with respect to discussion regarding threatened litigation in rock quarry accident. At 10:18 A.M., motion by Hineline and second by Quist to end closed session. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman again stated the reason for the closed session was to protect the public interest with respect to discussion regarding threatened litigation. Note- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman again stated the reason for the closed session was to protect the public interest with respect to discussion regarding threatened litigation in rock quarry accident. No action was taken.

Motion by Clausen second by Hineline to go back to the earlier flood update agenda item and amend it. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Kruger moved, seconded by Clausen that as a part of the flood update, Washington County's policy is to approve and issue building permits on a conditional basis to people in the flood area before Jan 6 to preserve their appeal process for those affected properties, but the conditional building permits would be issued pending further evidence and review of loss. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Board discussed issuing conditional building permits.

There were no comments from the public. Claims were received and reviewed, following which it was moved by Kruger and seconded by Hineline that the following claims be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Vote- Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.
