## July 10, 2012 Minutes Washington County Board of Supervisors Supervisor's Room Courthouse Blair, Nebraska 68008

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 8:35 a.m. on Tuesday, July 10, 2012 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman, Mary Alice Johnson, declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Johnson made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairman, Mary Alice Johnson, County Board Members, Kent Clausen, Jerry Kruse, Jeff Quist, Steve Kruger, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen.

Motion Kruger second Hineline to approve agenda for July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2012. Vote-Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Abariotes discussed a correction to the June 26<sup>th</sup> minutes where Quist's motion should have said "to accept the bid for two Caterpillar 12Ms." It was moved by Abariotes and seconded by Kruger that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the June 26, 2012 meeting be approved with the aforementioned correction, but not read at this meeting for the reason that all board members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote-Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Abariotes and seconded by Kruger that the regular monthly fee reports of the following officials be received and placed on file: Co Clerk \$432.75, Reg of Deeds \$26,361.25, Co Court \$16,496.57, Co Plan Dept \$3,121.00, Clk Dist Crt \$2093.86, Sheriff \$2542.22 and Road Dept \$188,071.29. Vote-Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence has been received: State Dept of Revenue Lodging Tax for March \$1517.05, April \$1464.12, May \$1376.93, June \$1443.22. It was moved by Kruse and seconded by Clausen that the correspondence be received and placed on file. Vote-Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Cheryl Parsons, Hwy. Supt., had Dan Norman, Civil Solutions, address the Board about the proposal for road borings to determine the best approach for rehabilitating County Road 4 (Herman Scribner Road). Norman said the proposal is for 10-12 borings and by comparing the bad areas to the good areas of pavement, they will get an idea of what to recommend to improve the subgrade. The proposal is for not to exceed \$13,500. Norman had included \$4,000 for traffic control which Parsons said could be deducted as she planned on having a County Road crew do the traffic control. Terracon will be doing the boring and select the sites to bore. Motion Kruger second Hineline to authorize Chairman to sign the Civil Solutions proposal for road borings, not to exceed \$9,500.00. Vote-Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Parsons set up a Road Committee meeting for July 16 and gave a brief update of road projects.

Clerk read Resolution 2012-19 regarding County inventory forms. Motion Kruger second Quist to adopt Resolution 2012-19. Vote-Aye: Clausen, Kruse, Quist, Johnson, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

## **RESOLUTION 2012-19**

**WHEREAS**, County Officers are required to make and file an Inventory Statement as per Nebr. State Statute 23-347, and

**WHEREAS**, the Washington County Board of Supervisors needs to have in place a policy pertaining to fixed assets.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Washington County Board of Supervisors hereby establishes a written policy pertaining to fixed assets. That all fixed assets shall be listed on the form prescribed by the Auditor of Public Accounts as per Nebr. State Statute 23-346, listing the inventory tag number, serial number (if there is one), description, acquisition date and the original cost or estimated historical cost at acquisition.

- 1. All large items such as desks, chairs, filing cabinets, etc and all large equipment such as vehicles and road equipment, etc.,
- 2. All law enforcement equipment such as fire arms, holsters, bullet proof vests, etc.,
- 3. All computers, radios, cell phones, pagers, answering machines, televisions, cameras, etc.,
- 4. Any item with a cost of \$100.00 or more.
- 5. That all office supplies such as pens, staplers, letter openers, etc. and janitorial supplies do not need to be listed.

Robert Smith was present for his Substantial Damage Assessment appeal. Chairperson stated 4 Board members had looked at the property. Board discussed the material list, which was purchased from A&R Salvage, and what parts of the cabin were salvageable. Board discussed fixing a cement wall which was bowed out. Smith brought in an appraisal which stated the market value of this property was \$33,000. Quist said the Board needs to look at whether they feel the property is salvageable, does it look like the estimated cost seems reasonable and what the value of the property is.
