January 22, 2013 Minutes Washington County Board of Supervisors Supervisor's Room Courthouse Blair, Nebraska 68008

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 8:38 a.m. on Tuesday, January 22, 2013 in the Supervisor's meeting room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman Jeff Quist declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting was being recorded. Chairman made note that the Open Meetings Law was posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairman, Jeff Quist, County Board Members, Paul Cerio, Jerry Kruse, Steven Kruger, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Mary Alice Johnson was absent. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen and Deputy County Attorney Ed Talbot.

Motion Kruger second Kruse to approve the agenda for January 22, 2013. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Dennis McCormick questioned wording in Jan 8th minutes. It was moved by Abariotes and seconded by Kruger that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the Jan 8, 2013 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all Board Members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. There was no correspondence.

Quist handed out the following committee appointments for the Board: 2013 Washington County Board of Supervisor Committees (First name on each Committee is Chairman) Finance: Kruger, Quist, Johnson; Buildings and Grounds: Abariotes, Quist, Kruse; Assistance: Hineline, Kruger, Cerio; Insurance: Quist, Hineline, Kruse; Personnel Manual Update: Johnson, Hineline, Abariotes; FOP Negotiation: Abariotes, Hineline, Johnson; Appointed Official Evaluation Procedure: Johnson, Abariotes, Kruse; Joint County Board/County Planning: Kruger, Quist, Kruse; Jail: Kruger, Kruse, Abariotes; Technology: Kruger, Johnson, Cerio; Road Committee: Kruger, Quist, Kruse, Hineline, Cerio remaining Board members are welcome to attend. Representatives to the following: ENHSA: Kruse primary, Johnson alternate; Northeast Nebraska Community Action Partnership: Duane Wilcox (private sector representative); Papio NRD: Kruse primary, Kruger alternate; Region 5/6 Emergency Management: Hineline primary, Johnson alternate; MAPA: Abariotes primary, Kruger alternate; Gateway Development: Abariotes, Quist; NE Nebraska Juvenile Detention: Kruger primary, Kruse alternate; County Visitor's Promotion: Johnson, Cerio; Public Health District Advisory Board: Hineline primary, Johnson secondary. Committees that meet on an "as needed" basis. E-911 & Communications Committee: (Appt 1/8/13) Quist, Johnson, Hineline.

Cheryl Parsons, Hwy Supt, was absent. Julie Ogden, JEO Consulting Group Inc, discussed plan changes on the Marshall-Nursery Road Project C89(531). Ogden said they had a meeting on site, then had another meeting at the Road Dept with the adjoining property owner and discussed his concerns about raising the flow line of the culvert by 5 feet. The County is working with the landowner and the NRD to see if this project will still qualify for the \$150,000 grant with plan changes. Proposed plan changes include adding drain tiles, manhole/s and a pipe collection system. Ogden will add these options on the plan as alternate bid items. Board discussed the project then continued this to February 12 meeting.

Ogden next discussed JEO does have a design plan for the overlay on the re-habilitation of Bridge #C89-02020 and are looking at bidding this project with a contractor other than the original contractor. Talbot said this bridge is in litigation and is closed, but the County would like to move forward, correct the deficiencies and open it. Ogden went through the punch list of items to be completed. Board discussed the project and will look at approving the design plan and setting a letting date for construction of this project at the February 12 meeting.

Board discussed having a hearing for the One & Six Year Road Plan. Motion Kruger second Kruse to set the One & Six Year Road Plan hearing date for February 4, 2013 at 7:00 pm in the Multipurpose Room at the Courthouse. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger and Hineline. Abariotes abstained. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Tanna Wirtz, Planning & Zoning, said the City has agreed to do the County's structural, mechanical and plumbing inspections while the building inspector is absent. Wirtz said she had contacted several people about doing electrical inspections. Jesse Robinson has agreed to do electrical inspections for the County and Blair City while the building inspector is absent. Motion

Kruger second Hineline to approve contracting with Jesse Robinson to do electrical inspections for a flat rate of \$40 for the County and \$37 for the City, subject to Robinson's contract being reviewed by the County Attorney's office. Dennis McCormick spoke. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Wirtz asked to continue the agenda item of appointing Board of Adjustment members.

David Drozd, UNO, who was going to speak to Board members about a projection of population for Washington County, was not able to attend the meeting.

Phil Lorenzen, DA Davidson, had informational packets for the Board and spoke briefly on bond market conditions, outstanding bonds the County has, the benefits of refunding some at lower interest rates in the fall and future bonds for road improvement. Ogden spoke of the life of concrete/road projects. Lorenzen had a refunding Resolution calling the balance of Courthouse bond and said paying off the Courthouse bonds early would mean a savings of approximately \$6,000. Kruger said in preparing the budget, it was budgeted to use inheritance tax money to pay off the Courthouse bond early. Motion Kruger second Kruse to adopt Resolution 2013-2. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-2

RESOLUTION CALLING GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2008, FOR REDEMPTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, as follows:

Section 1. That the following bonds are hereby called for redemption in accordance with the resolution providing for their issuance, at par plus accrued interest on March 15, 2013 after which date said bonds shall cease to bear interest:

General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2008, Dated March 15, 2008, in the principal amount of \$240,000, becoming due on December 1, 2013, issued by the County for the purpose of refunding the County's previously issued and outstanding General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2002, and to pay costs of underwriting and issuance associated with the said Series 2002 Bonds.

Section 2. Said bonds are payable at the office of the First National Bank of Omaha, Omaha, Nebraska as Paying Agent and Registrar.

Section 3. A copy of this resolution shall be filed at least 30 days prior to the date of call with the First National Bank of Omaha, Omaha, Nebraska, as Paying Agent and Registrar and said Paying Agent and Registrar is hereby instructed to give notice of redemption in the manner provided for in the ordinance authorizing said bonds.

Capt Phil Brazelton had Talbot review the contracts regarding upgrading the computer aided dispatch (CAD) system. Brazelton said he was just informed the cost to interface information from Intergraph Records Management System was \$22,000, not the \$3,000 he had estimated. Brazelton said he would try to negotiate this down, but even at \$22,000, this would still save money in the long run on our maintenance fees. Brazelton requested permission to send a letter to InterAct saying we no longer need their services and send a letter of intent to Douglas County that we will be joining them in their CAD system. Board discussed the cost. Sheriff Robinson said when you have computers there are continual costs for upgrading and updating. Blair Police Chief Joe Lager asked to be included in meetings regarding the CAD changes. Motion Kruger second Kruse to have Brazelton meet with the 911 Sub-Committee to go over the information and continue this to the February 12 meeting. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Bill Burdess read a letter stating how, in his opinion, the Board adopted a budget that deceived and fleeced the taxpayers and maligned some county employees. Wes Stamp, Dennis McCormick and Bob Warrick spoke. There was lengthy discussion on various topics that included the budget, raises and hiring a CPA to prepare the budget. Abariotes left the meeting. Wes Stamp had questions about the budget process that included the inheritance tax fund, wage increases, operating disbursements and the

cash reserve. There was lengthy discussion. Kruger said the Board approved a budget that lowered the tax asking dollars and lowered the levy from the previous year. Cerio said he would draw up a proposal for an outside consultant to prepare the budget.

Talbot informed the Board that NIRMA had reached a settlement agreement in the amount of \$115,000 for Joseph Wieczorek's Tort Claim.

Comments from the public: Dennis McCormick spoke.

At 11:26 motion was made by Kruger and seconded by Kruse to enter into closed session. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger and Hineline. Abariotes absent. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman stated the reason for the closed session was in order to protect the public interest with respect to litigation with Sanitary Improvement District #1, Butler County, Nebraska. At 11:37, motion by Kruse and second by Hineline to end closed session. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger and Hineline. Abariotes absent. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman again stated the reason for the closed session was to protect the public interest with respect to litigation with SID#1, Butler County, Nebraska. Motion Kruger second Hineline to allow the County Attorney's office to handle the class action suit in reference to the fees collected by the SID. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger and Hineline. Abariotes absent. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Claims were received and reviewed, following which it was moved by Kruger and seconded by Kruse that the following claims be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist and Kruger. Hineline abstained. Abariotes absent. Nay: None. Motion carried.
