

**February 12, 2013 Minutes  
Washington County Board of Supervisors  
Supervisor's Room Courthouse  
Blair, Nebraska 68008**

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 8:40 a.m. on Tuesday, February 12, 2013 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman Jeff Quist declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Quist made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door of the north wall. Present: Chairman, Jeff Quist, County Board Members, Paul Cerio, Jerry Kruse, Mary Alice Johnson, Steve Kruger, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hinline. Also present, County Clerk Deputy, Robin Miller.

It was moved by Kruse and second by Kruger to approve the agenda for the February 12, 2013. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion Carried. Dennis McCormick spoke saying he would like to see public comments in the paper. Scott Japp said he had visited with the Attorney General's Office and there is no statutory requirement to print public comments. It was moved by Kruse and seconded by Kruger that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the January 22, 2013 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all board members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Johnson abstained. Motion carried.

It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Kruse that the regular monthly fee reports of the following officials be received and placed on file: Co Clerk \$269.75, Reg of Deeds \$26,246.50, Co Court \$20,218.70, Co Plan Dept \$5,736.00, Clk Dist Crt \$2,193.20, Sheriff \$2,974.90 and Road Dept \$20,590.92. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence has been received: Lodging tax for Dec \$1,104.52 and Jan \$1,021.20, and information from the Extension Office Year 2012 in review and Assistance for Drought Issues. It was moved by Kruse and seconded by Abariotes that the correspondence be received and placed on file. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Cheryl Parsons, Road Superintendent, updated the Board on correspondence from the Nebraska Department of Roads regarding the Bridge Inspection Program. A committee of maintainer operators and foremen will keep watch on any changes after a rain event of fracture and scour on critical bridges. Parsons will continue regular inspections every August.

Several member of the public were present when Julie Ogden, JEO Consulting Group Inc, discussed final plans for the Marshall-Nursery Road Project C89(531). Ogden reviewed the project: they would replace a single barrel arch box with a triple barrel rectangular concrete box culvert which would include a stilling basin. Base bid is \$375,000 for removal of existing box culvert, construction and replacement of new box culvert, engineering costs \$39,000, paving is estimated at \$12,000 and drainage items are \$4,000 for a total of approx \$430,000, minus the NRD Grant of \$150,000. If the bid is not let in March, the County may need to file an extension for the \$150,000 grant. Property owner Todd Schmidt submitted a "Petition to revise current culvert replacement plans on P38 Marshall Nursery Rd" with 59 signatures and said he will not give the County an easement. Schmidt would like to see a tube used. Ogden said the inlet wouldn't have to be raised 5 feet for the culvert box, but if it isn't raised, the County will lose the NRD grant of \$150,000. Scott Japp, NRD board member, suggested bringing this proposal to the NRD April board meeting to see if the NRD would be willing to forward the project on to next year. Tyler Schmidt said he did not understand why the culvert has to be so big. Ogden said based on the hydraulic studies done, this is what the NRD recommended. Hinline made the motion to table this project for further research, Cerio seconded. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion Carried.

As directed at last meeting, Ogden had put together a bid package for receiving quotes to address the punch list items that were left undone as well as place the overlay on Bridge Project C89(457), also referred to as Bridge C89-02020. The bid was broken into 3 parts: 1) punch list repairs 2) railing & guard rail repairs 3) bridge overlay. Ogden came up with an estimated cost of \$80,000 for the repairs. Board discussed the project, including welding and a warranty and said they need to complete the repairs and get the bridge open. Dennis McCormick spoke. It was moved by Kruger second by Kruse to let the bids on this

bridge project. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion Carried. Road Committee will study the bids then bring a recommendation to 3-12-13 board meeting.

Several members of the public were present when Parsons handed out copies of the One & Six Year Road Plan for 2013. Parsons said the public hearing was held Feb 4, 2013 and from comments at that meeting some changes were made: Road Projects C89-(558), C89(345A) and C89(427) were added to the 1 Year Plan. Road Projects C89(427)B and C89(559) were added to the 6 Year Plan. Greg Petersen, Kari Loeske and Wes Stamp spoke. Kruse made the motion to approve the One and Six Year Road Plan as presented today, Kruger seconded. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger and Hinline. Nay: Abariotes. Motion Carried. Copies of the 1 & 6 Year Plan are available at the Road Dept or Clerk's Office.

Ogden gave the Board an update on plans and permits for both phases of the Fort Calhoun "cut-across" identified as State Road Projects RS-3840(7) and RS-3840(8). Ogden said plans for Phase 2, also known as Fort Calhoun West C89(20), are almost complete and they are working on Phase 3, aka Kennard Southeast C89(202). Ogden said the Nebraska Department of Roads strongly encourages the County to wait until the Hwy 133 project is completed before paving the county road. Parsons mentioned the State has a 220' of right of way on Hwy 133 and that the County would need a permit to begin the project. Board discussed the project. JEO is currently working with the utilities departments. Bonding for this project was discussed.

Capt. Phil Brazelton presented updated information regarding the computer aided dispatch (CAD) system upgrade, which included firm pricing and a flow chart showing the interdependency of equipment involved. 911 Committee members Johnson and Quist had requested Brazelton obtain a quote of joining onto the Sarpy and Douglas records management system instead of purchasing the interface from our present vendor Intergraph. The Motorola quote was in excess of \$750,000.00, and it was also discovered that neither Sarpy nor Douglas had this new system in place yet, thus rendering that idea a moot point at this time. Brazelton said a copy of the proposed contract from Intergraph was being reviewed by Deputy Co. Atty. Ed Talbot. Sheriff Mike Robinson and Blair Police Chief Joe Lager both presented information on problems occurring with the current system and how the purchase of the CAD system will take care of many of these issues. They stressed this system is used for all public safety agencies dispatched by the County, and that the County would save money in the long run in annual maintenance costs, which are substantially reduced by this purchase. Board discussed the upgrade. Lt. Aaron Barrow, Blair Police, spoke of how the present software was not keeping up with demands, and the necessity to update software as the technology changes. The system has a total purchase price of \$145,160.00, with \$67,188, being paid from the Public Service Commission E911 Set Aside, making the cost to the County approximately \$79,000.00. Most of this cost will be budgeted in the 2013-14 budget year, with the exception of the interface and maintenance costs from Intergraph, of which 50% will be billed upon acceptance of their contract. The City of Blair will pay some maintenance costs for the interface, based upon the present formula used for their portion of the records management system. The 911 Communications Subcommittee made a recommendation that the system be purchased. Motion by Johnson, second by Hinline to move ahead with this project pending the legal review of the interface contract. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes, and Hinline. Nay: None. Motion Carried.

David Drozd, UNO Research Coordinator, presented a Comparison of Historical Washington County Population Counts and Components of Change Versus Prochaska and Associates Projections. His conclusions were the projections have a very high population increase compared to what has actually occurred in Washington County. With the high proportions of older persons including "baby boomers" ages 45-64 in 2010, and a small proportion in child-bearing year (ages 20-34) the population growth contribution from births exceeding deaths is likely to continue to dwindle over the next few decades. Nebraska has traditionally had a net out migration of persons aged 55-74 (retirees) as they make their retirement location decisions and potentially move out of the area over the next few decades. Kruger mentioned that most of our incarcerated individuals are not in the ages of 55-74, he asked about the increase in ages 17-25. Drozd said the 2010 Census included approximately 400 Dana College students who have moved to other Colleges and the crime age of 17-25 is scaling back to go out of town to other colleges. Statistics

show Washington County is having 50 more births than deaths. The Board asked several questions regarding the future of the County and reasons to migrate out of the County. Nebraska has been growing about 5% per decade. Sheriff Robinson said that Prochaska & Associates used population projections developed by UNL. Blair Police Chief, Joe Lager stated that very few of the Dana College students were actually jailed whereas the Walmart traffic is tremendous and those people are being jailed. Lager sees Blair turning into an Elkhorn with more day time population.

Tanna Wirtz, Planning Administrator was present regarding the appointment of members to the Board of Adjustments. After discussion, Wirtz's recommendation was: Dan Koziol and Chris Bilau for 3 yr terms, Gene Ohrt 1 yr term, David Taylor 2 yr term with Irwin Nelson as an alternate for a 2 yr term and Planning Commission member Steve Neuverth, a 1 yr term. It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Kruger to appoint members of the Board of Adjustment as per Wirtz's recommendation. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, and Abariotes. Nay: Kruse. Hineline abstained. Motion Carried. Motion by Johnson second by Kruger to approve the length of terms as recommended by Wirtz. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion Carried.

No closed session was held for the Sheriff's Office FOP labor negotiations and litigations.

Chairman asked for discussion on legislative bills. Dennis McCormick asked the Board to write a letter to the Legislature in support of LB5, regarding exempting Social Security Benefits and Military Retirement income from income taxation. Board discussed the bill. Wes Stamp spoke about the bill. Hineline and Abariotes will research LB5 and report back at the next meeting.

Paul Cerio discussed the timeline and process for the 2013-2014 budget year and asked if the Board wanted to secure an independent source to assist the Finance Committee. The Board explained the process used in the past years and the deadlines. Cerio then asked who is responsible to put that together. Kruger said they asked the County Clerk to assemble the numbers for the final budget. Wes Stamp gave his opinion on how the County should document and complete the budget. Cerio asked the Finance Committee make a draft on how the budget process will be done.

William Burdess read his letter regarding budget expenditures and asked what percentage the finance committee initially said for county employee raises. Johnson said the committee wanted it to be about 1½ %.

The Personnel Committee visited with the Planning Administrator and made a recommendation to approve her vacation for 12 days with no pay. It was moved by Kruse and seconded by Johnson to approve the Planning Administrator's vacation with no pay. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: Quist and Krueger. Motion carried.

Public Comment: Wes Stamp spoke about the county website. Dennis McCormick spoke about the minutes.

Claims were received and reviewed. It was moved by Kruse and seconded by Kruger that the following claims be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Vote-Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried
