May 14, 2013 Minutes Washington County Board of Supervisors Supervisor's Room Courthouse Blair, Nebraska 68008

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 8:35 AM on Tuesday, May 14, 2013 in the Supervisor's Meeting Room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman Jeff Quist declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Quist made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairman, Jeff Quist, County Board Members, Paul Cerio, Jerry Kruse, Steve Kruger, Ernest Abariotes and Ron Hineline. Mary Alice Johnson was absent. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen.

Motion Kruger second Kruse to approve agenda for May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2013. Board discussed wording on the agenda that allows for moving "non-timed" agenda items around. Vote- Aye: Kruse, Quist, Kruger and Abariotes. Nay: Hineline and Cerio. Johnson absent. Motion carried. It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Hineline that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the April 23, 2013 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all board members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Johnson absent. Motion carried.

It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Hineline that the regular monthly fee reports of the following officials be received and placed on file: Co Clerk \$267.25, Reg of Deeds \$22,289.25, Co Court \$16,900.17, Co Plan Dept \$7,936.00, Clk Dist Crt \$2458.59, Sheriff \$2,946.60 and Road Dept \$965.70 for scrap iron and \$557.18 accts receivable. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Johnson absent. Motion carried.

Johnson was present. The following correspondence had been received: copy of letter sent to Region 6 from Board, Kruse has statistical information from Region 6, Dept of Roads' State Transportation Improvement Plan is on line, letter from Jeri Hoffman re: cabin on leased property that was flooded and letter complimenting Sheriff Deputy Carritt. Hineline talked about information received at a meeting regarding the Accountability and Disclosure form. It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Kruse that the correspondence be received and placed on file. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Dan Norman, Civil Solutions, said concrete patching for Co Rd 4 (Herman-Scribner Rd) and Co Rd 32 is completed, but as expected a couple new spots have appeared on CR4 and will be addressed this fall. Norman discussed the condition of the roads and the repairs ME Collins have done. Norman discussed Change Order 2 which included 2 additional panels patched on CR32. This brings the total cost of the project to \$75,701.30. Motion Kruger second Hineline to accept Change Order #2 for \$6,447.36. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Motion Kruse second Kruger to pay the remaining 10% retainage of \$7,570.13 at the next meeting. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

At 9:00 AM Cheryl Parsons, Hwy Supt, read through the Corrugated Metal Pipe proposals for Fiscal Year 2013-2014. Three bids were received: Metal Culverts, Inc; B's Enterprises, Inc; Midwest Service & Sales. Board discussed the bids with Parsons and Robert Smith, Road Foreman. Kruger moved, seconded by Kruse to accept all bids (like last year) allowing Parsons the ability to order what is needed at the lowest price. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Quist spoke of meeting with JEO Consulting Group, Inc. to discuss any drainage issues that might result from removing 2 cattle crossings on the Ft Calhoun West grading project. JEO representatives Rob Brigham, Eric Obert and Scott Cowles were present. Kruger talked of proceeding with the project since JEO confirmed drainage will not be affected and said reimbursing Gene and Kathy Ohrt \$25,000 for no longer having the cattle crossings was a big savings over constructing new cattle crossings. Gene Ohrt was present. Kruger moved, seconded by Hineline, to enter into an agreement with Ohrts and to pay them \$25,000 for removing two cattle crossings. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Hineline said the engineering to replace Bridge C89(223) on Co Road P26 at DeSoto was done many years ago, with Township 2 paying \$10,000 toward the engineering, and Hineline wants to make sure this project moves forward. Several people from the area were present. Richard Kruse discussed the bridge, mentioning the age of the bridge, lack of sight when approaching the one lane bridge and said he had talked to Julie Ogden, JEO, about replacing it with a concrete culvert. Parsons read an email from Ogden that said the engineering for the bridge has been completed and discussed a traffic count done. Cost of the bridge is estimated at \$500,000. Board discussed using a box culvert. Mary Sully, Jeanenne Boll and Patricia O'Donnell spoke of the road hazard the one lane bridge presents. The bridge design was discussed. Jerry Kruse spoke of looking at other options and eliminating the bridge. Chair said he would like this discussed further. Motion Cerio second Johnson to table this, get updated numbers from JEO, discuss at a Road Committee meeting and put it back on the 5/28 agenda. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Terra Uhing, recently appointed Executive Director for Three Rivers Health Dept, introduced herself, handed out brochures on Kids Services and Public Health and visited with the Board.

Kruger moved, seconded by Kruse to authorize Chairman to sign the Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to the Federal-Aid Transportation Fund purchase-sale agreement between the Nebraska Dept of Roads and Washington County and adopt Resolution 2013-12. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

## RESOLUTION 2013 – 12 SIGNING OF THE FEDERAL FUNDS PURCHASE PROGRAM SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 1

WHEREAS, in 2011, LPA and the State entered into a Federal-Aid Transportation Fund Purchase-Sale Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "the Original Agreement") that provided for the State to purchase at a discount LPA's share of certain Surface Transportation Program Funding (hereinafter referred to as "STP") and the Highway Bridge Program (hereinafter referred to as "HBP") federal-aid funds that had been available to Nebraska LPAs; and,

**WHEREAS**, later in 2012, the federal government passed interim transportation funding legislation which eliminated the HBP category of funds and did not provide a replacement category of funds related solely to bridge replacement, rehabilitation and maintenance; and,

**WHEREAS**, the parties to this Supplemental Agreement intend to replace the HBP funds, which will no longer be available, with other federal-aid funds in a substantially similar proportional amount to provide LPAs with funds for bridge replacement, rehabilitation and maintenance; and

**WHEREAS**, it has also become necessary for the parties to further address certain National Bridge Inspection Standards compliance issues.

**WHEREAS,** Washington County and the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) wish to enter into Supplemental Agreement No. 1 setting out the necessary modifications to the Original Agreement.

**Be It Resolved:** by the governing body of Washington County that:

Jeff Quist, Chairman is hereby authorized to sign the attached Federal Funds Purchase Program Supplemental Agreement No. 1 between Washington County and the NDOR.

**Whereas:** Washington County understands that it must continue to strictly follow all Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guideline applicable to the funding of the Federal-aid project; and

**Whereas:** Washington County and NDOR wish to enter into Supplemental Program Agreement No. 1 setting out modifications and/or additional duties and/or funding responsibilities for the Federal-aid project.

Be It Resolved: by the Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska that:

Jeff Quist, Chair of the Washington County Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to sign the attached Supplemental Program Agreement No. 1 between Washington County and the NDOR.

There was no discussion on legislative bills.

Ron Hineline discussed the Board's name plates. Motion Hineline second Kruger to order name plates that say "Chairman" and "County Clerk". Vote- Aye: Cerio, Johnson, Quist, Kruger and Hineline. Nay: Kruse and Abariotes. Motion carried. Hineline next discussed the Board's committees and handed out information on "Effective Committees". Motion Hineline second Abariotes to direct Chair to fill in if a member is absent for a committee meeting and have monthly committee reports on the agenda. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Quist next asked for committee reports, as that was on the agenda. Board briefly discussed various committees. The Technology Committee has been discussing the county website and the Jail Committee is waiting on an updated contract from Prochaska & Assoc. Finance Committee continued their discussion on the budget preparer. Kruger said at the last meeting he pulled his motion to hire Clerk Truhlsen to prepare the County budget when Hineline raised a question in regard to a Statute. Kruger reported the Co Atty's office reviewed the Statute and said there is no conflict when this is acted on in a public meeting. Kruger moved, seconded by Kruse, to hire Merry Truhlsen as the budget making authority for the 2013-2014 County Budget for \$3,000. Board discussed having the Clerk prepare the budget. Hineline said Truhlsen should be paid with a 1099. Clerk and Wes Stamp said this payment should go through payroll. Cerio said he would like an agreement drawn up outlining duties. Quist said duties are outlined in statute and read through the statute. Vote-Aye: Kruse, Quist, Kruger and Abariotes. Nay: Johnson, Abariotes and Hineline. Motion carried.

There were no comments from the public.

At 11:20 AM motion was made by Kruse and seconded by Kruger to enter into closed session. Chairman stated the reason for the closed session was in order to protect the public interest with respect to Sheriff's Office FOP labor negotiations and litigation. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. At 12:35 PM, motion by Johnson and second by Kruse to end closed session. Chairman again stated the reason for the closed session was in order to protect the public interest with respect to Sheriff's Office FOP labor negotiations and litigation. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. No action was taken.

Chairman said Dep County Attorney Ed Talbot said there didn't have to be a closed session to discuss litigation with Investors for Infrastructure, but had requested a committee be appointed to assist with mediation in this case. Chairman Quist appointed himself, Kruger and Kruse.

Cerio discussed the agenda, then made a motion, seconded by Hineline, to amend wording on the agenda to say "Any non-timed agenda item may be moved....". Board discussed the agenda. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Claims were received and reviewed, following which it was moved by Kruger and seconded by Kruse that the following claims be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kruse, Johnson, Quist, Kruger, Abariotes and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.
