Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

At 4:15, Board resumed the Supervisor's meeting. Lorenzen noted an error in the press release read at the 7/12 meeting and published for officials salaries, it referred to the Board as Commissioners, not Supervisors. It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Quist that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the July 12, 2016, meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all board members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Hwy Supt Bill Hansel gave the Board an update on various road projects. Hansel discussed a Speece Lewis Engineer proposal for structure replacement on CR7. Speece Lewis will determine what structure will be suitable and listed fees as \$14,000 for a box culvert or \$24,000 for a simple span bridge.
