The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct 11, 2016 in the Supervisor's meeting room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman Lorenzen declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Lorenzen made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the north wall. Present: Chairman Carl Lorenzen, County Board Members, Paul Cerio, Lisa Kramer, Jeff Quist, Steven Kruger and Ron Hineline. Mary Alice Johnson was absent. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen.

Motion Kruger second Hineline to approve agenda for October 11, 2016. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. It was moved by Quist and seconded by Hineline that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the September 27 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all board members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Quist that the regular monthly fee reports of the following officials be received and placed on file: Co Clerk \$573, Reg of Deeds \$38,751, Co Court \$19,829, Co Plan Dept \$13,400; Clk Dist Crt \$3531, Sheriff \$2,481 and Road Dept \$599; Sept. Treas Statement- Collections \$748,607; Disbursements \$1,042,538; Inheritance Tax \$622,387; Ending balance \$7,742,832. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Motion Kruger second Quist that the following correspondence be received and placed on file: letter from Jail Standards Div saying the Wash Co Jail was inspected and was determined to be in compliance and 2016 MAPA Annual Report. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Bill Hansel, Hwy Supt, had given the Board copies of his annual report for Board of Public Roads Classification and Standards. Motion Hineline second Kramer to receive annual report and authorize Chairman to sign the Road & Bridge Contracts Report and the Certification to Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Hansel had attended the conference put on by the County's insurance carrier, NIRMA, and picked up a dividend check for \$12,106. Hansel discussed Legislative Bill 960 regarding bridges. Hansel discussed the box culvert on CR30. Rock hauled in Sept was 2,100 ton and gravel hauled was 4,000 ton.

Hansel said he used the State bid to purchase a CAT 12M3AWD and a John Deere 772GP. Board discussed the bids. Motion Hineline second Quist to accept the state bids submitted for a CAT for \$162,000 with a 2012 CAT trade-in; and a John Deere 772GP for \$172,665.09 with a 2011 JD trade-in. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: Kruger. Motion carried.

Hansel had discussed putting some vehicles on the State surplus auction with the Road Committee: 2005 Dodge Durango, 2010 Chevy Impala (both from the Sheriff), 1979 Ford F350 dump truck, 1987 Chevrolet ½ ton pickup and an old boom mower. Board discussed the vehicles. Motion Hineline second Cerio to put the surplus vehicles and mower on the Oct 15th State auction. Motion Kruger second Quist to amend the motion to exclude the 1979 Ford dump truck from the list of surplus vehicles. Vote-Aye: Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: Cerio. Motion carried. Board next voted on the original motion as follows- Vote Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Hansel said at the Road Committee meeting they discussed purchasing a pickup off the State bid for him to use. The pickup received from the Sheriff's office went to the Weed Dept and during the winter Hansel's pickup is used to push snow. Motion Quist second Hineline to table until the State bids are available. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: Kruger. Motion carried. Hansel gave an update on road projects.

Keith Marvin, Marvin Planning Consultants, gave the Board an update on the County's Comprehensive Development Plan. Marvin will be holding public meetings and getting input on the plan, and is looking at next May for a completion date.

Ryan Sullivan, Planning & Zoning Admin had the following public hearings:

- 1. General Development Plan request by Barry Kolterman A proposed 10-lot residential subdivision, to be known as Homestead 77, from the NW¼SE¼ and Tax Lot 23, Section 6 Township 17 Range 12 (general location: CR P35 north of CR 32). Motion Kruger second Kramer to open a public hearing. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Sullivan discussed the plan and Planning Comm. comments. Motion Kruger second Quist to close public hearing. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Motion Kruger second Quist to concur with Planning Commission to approve the General Development Plan. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.
- 2. Preliminary Plat request by Barry Kolterman A proposed 10-lot residential subdivision, to be known as Homestead 77, from the NW¹/₄SE¹/₄ and Tax Lot 23, Sec 6-T17-R12. Motion Kruger second Quist to open public hearing. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Sullivan recapped the Planning Commission's discussion and handed out additional information received since the Plan Comm met. Sullivan said a tie vote at the Plan Comm meeting resulted in not approving the preliminary plat. Barry and Vicky Kolterman discussed the subdivision. Dennis Whitfield, Surveyor, gave the Board revised plans for Homestead 77 and discussed the changes. Motion Kruger second Quist to close public hearing. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Motion Kramer second Quist to refer the revised preliminary plat for Homestead 77 back to the Planning Commission for their recommendation with the revisions and then have preliminary plat come back to the Board for a vote. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Kipp Kissinger, UNICO, went through information reviewed at the Insurance Committee meeting, which included United Healthcare's health insurance renewal info and quotes received from Aetna and Blue Cross. Motion Kruger second Quist to concur with the Insurance Committee's recommendation to renew with United Healthcare's current plan. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Jesse Gonzalez, Bldg Maint, introduced Jason Cloudt, with Security Equipment Inc, to go over the bid for increasing security at the Courthouse and Law Enforcement building by adding automated door locks on 4 doors. Cloudt discussed the proposals given to the Board. Motion Kruger second Quist to accept the SEi bid on the Courthouse doors for \$5,884, Law Enforcement doors for \$1,913, add 2 inner doors at Sheriff's Office for \$1,200 and purchase 200 key cards for \$850. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Marj Hoier, Co Treas, was present regarding the Board's decision on the Annual Report of Delinquent Taxes. Motion Quist second Hineline to have the County Treasurer issue County Tax Sale Certificates on 6 parcels that were delinquent 3 years or more. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Motion Hineline second Cerio to go into a closed session at 11:32 am in order to protect public interest for the purpose of a legal strategy session concerning site selection whereby protected attorney client privilege discussion will ensue. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Those present were 6 Board members, Deputy County Attorney Jen Walkingstick, Sheriff Mike Robinson and Chief Deputy Kevin Willis. Chairman said the Closed Session was in order to protect public interest for the purpose of a legal strategy session concerning site selection whereby protected attorney client privilege discussion will ensue. Motion Cerio second Kramer to go out of closed session at 11:53 am. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Kramer, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman restated the closed session was in order to protect public interest for the purpose of a legal strategy session concerning site selection whereby protected attorney client privilege discussion will ensue. There was no action taken in open session.

Committee Reports – Kruger commented on the Juvenile Detention Center, Kramer-Region 6 and Region 5/6 and Cerio gave a recap of Heritage Days. There were no comments from the public.

Claims were received and reviewed, following which it was moved by Kruger and seconded by Quist that the following claims be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Kramer discussed a claim to Right Tech. Vote- Aye: Cerio, Quist, Kruger, Lorenzen and Hineline. Nay: Kramer. Motion carried.
