The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 3:20 pm on Tuesday, June 12, 2018 in the Supervisor's meeting room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman Steve Dethlefs declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Dethlefs made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the west wall. Present: Chairman, Steve Dethlefs, County Board Members, Lisa Kramer, Bob Frahm, Andy Andreasen, Steven Kruger and Jay Anderson. Carl Lorenzen absent. Also present, County Clerk Merry Truhlsen, and Co Atty Scott VanderSchaaf.

Motion Andreasen second Frahm to approve agenda for June 12, 2018. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried. It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Andreasen that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the May 22, 2018 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all board members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried. Frahm abstained.

It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Anderson that the regular monthly fee reports of the following officials be received and placed on file: Co Clerk \$359; Reg of Deeds \$35,149; Co Court \$17,872; Co Plan Dept \$22,708; Clk Dist Crt \$2,514; Sheriff \$2656; and Road Dept \$16,403; May Treas Statement- Collections \$1,061,139; Disbursements \$1,782,691; Inheritance Tax \$838,818, Ending balance \$9,779,703. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence has been received: letter from Dodge Co Board acknowledging the Region 5/6 agreement with Burt & Washington Co had expired and stated they are creating a new position of a Dodge Co Emergency Manager and Blair City Council notice of public hearing to discuss the Dana College Blight study. Bill Pook, Region 5/6, discussed the letter from the Dodge County Board. It was moved by Kruger and seconded by Andreasen that the correspondence be received and placed on file. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Bob Smith, Road Dept Foreman, and Kramer gave brief updates of road projects. Many Township Board members were present for the discussion of township fees. Kramer said the Road Committee recommended leaving the fees at the same cost as the 2017-2018 rate. Motion Kruger second Kramer to set Township fees at \$1,475.00 per mile for the 2018-2019 budget year. Vote-Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Three bids were received regarding financing for a 2018 Volvo excavator, purchased 2/13/18 for \$155,000, with trade-in and warranty. Chairman read through the bids: Two Rivers Bank- \$168,088.77; US Bank- \$171,730.41; Washington County Bank \$172,199. Motion Kramer second Frahm to award bid to Two Rivers Bank for \$168,088.77. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Kramer said Road Committee discussed doing a redesign of the Kennard Southeast STPE-3840(8) Project, on CR32 (aka Calhoun Cutoff) to request relaxation of some standards from the Board of Classifications of Roads. The redesign will also include the engineering for the repair and replacement of drainage structures along this road. If the changes on the redesign could show significant savings to the County, a relaxation may be granted. Estimated cost of engineer's redesign is approximately \$65,000. Mike Andersen voiced opposition. Motion Kramer second Kruger to have Speece-Lewis Engineers Inc redesign the Kennard SE STPE-3840(8) Project and apply for a relaxation. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: Frahm. Motion carried.

Kramer discussed Change Order #1 on Project C89(358), aka Blair North bridge. The main cost of the change order was additional steel piling required for the project. Motion Kruger second Kramer to approve change order #1 for \$27,396.96. Vote-Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Phil Lorenzen, DA Davidson, said the next step to move forward with financing for the Law Enforcement Judicial Center Project is to adopt Resolution 2018-6. The Resolution confirms the results of the bond election as certified by the County Clerk. William Burdess read and submitted a statement of opposition to the project. Motion Frahm second Anderson to review the canvass of the County Bond Election and adopt Resolution 2018-6. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-6

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Washington County, in the State of Nebraska (the "County"), as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") hereby finds and determines that pursuant to Resolution No. 2018-5 of the Board adopted on February 27, 2018, there was submitted to the qualified electors of the County at an election held in conjunction with the statewide Primary Election on May 15, 2018, a proposition for the issuance of bonds of the County in the principal amount of not to exceed Twenty-four Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$24,500,000) for the purpose of financing the costs of constructing additions to, expanding, improving, renovating, remodeling, equipping and furnishing the County's existing detention and justice facilities, including related site improvements, security improvements, public safety, and infrastructure improvements; that notice of said election and sample ballot were published as provided by law; that the ballots cast at said election were counted as provided by law for votes cast on a proposition submitted at a special election and that the report and certificate of election showing the results of the election have been delivered to this Board for the purpose of making a canvass thereof; and that said returns and certificate show that there were 4,748 ballots cast by the qualified electors of the County on such proposition of which 2,539 ballots were cast in favor of the proposition of issuing said bonds and levying a tax to be levied and collected annually against all taxable property in the County sufficient in rate and amount to pay the principal of, the premium, if any, and the interest on said Bonds as the same become due and payable and 2,209 ballots were cast against said proposition;

Section 2. The Board has canvassed said returns of said election and does hereby determine that a majority of all of the qualified electors voting on the question of said bonds and tax have voted in favor of issuing said bonds and the levy of the tax to pay the same.

Committee Reports- Bill Pook, Director, Region 5/6 Emergency Management, discussed his retirement on June 30 and the need to restructure the County's Emergency Management plan. Dan Douglas, whom the Board appointed as the Liaison Deputy for Region 5/6, was present. Chairman Dethlefs asked the Personnel Committee to work with the Sheriff's office and Blair City Police to develop the new department. Sheriff thanked Pook for doing a great job. Anderson said the Jail Committee met and turned in the final jail plans today, which need to be approved by Jail Standards and the Nebr Supreme Court. Mike Andersen spoke.

Comments from public- Mike Andersen spoke.

Board considered two Special Designated Licenses for the Washington County Fairgrounds: Moonshine Hole LLC, Roxie Kracl, Reception at Rybin Bldg, 8/25/2018 and MamaT & PapaD Enterprises, Tia Mentzer, Reception at Rybin Bldg, 7/14/2018. Motion Anderson second Kruger to authorize the Chairman sign both of the SDL Local Recommendation Forms. Vote-Aye: Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson, Dethlefs and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Sheriff Robinson discussed the poor condition of the memorial flags and flagpoles around the Courthouse. Robinson said it was the desire of the former Veteran's Service Officer, Gayle Maine, to honor veterans with an avenue of flags. These flags, which have engraved plaques attached, were to be flown on holidays and purchased by families in honor/memory of loved ones. Robinson said he would like to do a new campaign to replace the flags. Board discussed the information. Kruger made a motion

to compile the names and put them on a plaque displayed in the Courthouse, but withdrew his motion. Vote- Aye: Dethlefs, Kramer, Frahm, Andreasen, Anderson and Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried. Chairman restated that the closed session pertained to Sheriff's office personnel and payroll matters. In open session, motion Anderson second Andreasen to approve a promissory note pay agreement between Washington County and Sheriff's Dept. employee for \$4,083.00.
