January 22, 2019 Minutes Washington County Board of Supervisors Supervisor's Room Courthouse Blair, Nebraska 68008

The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 4:40 p.m. on Tuesday, January 22, 2019 in the Supervisor's meeting room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman Dethlefs declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Dethlefs made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the west wall. Present: Chairman, Steve Dethlefs, County Board Members, Jordan Rishel, Lisa Kramer, Bob Frahm, Andy Andreasen, Jay Anderson, and Steve Kruger. Also present, Co Sheriff Mike Robinson, and Co Attorney Scott VanderSchaaf.

Motion Frahm second Andreasen to approve agenda for January 22, 2019. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Kramer and seconded by Frahm that the rules be suspended and that the minutes of the January 8, 2019 meeting be approved but not read at this meeting for the reason that all board members were furnished a copy of said minutes prior to the meeting. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The following correspondence has been received: **1**. Notice of Public Hearing from City of Blair discuss Proposed Blair South Bypass. **2**. Notice of Public Hearing from Saunders County regarding Amendment to Zoning Regulations. Motion by Andreasen second by Rishel that the correspondence be received and placed on file. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Lisa Kramer, Road Committee, read Road Dept update from Bill Hansel in his absence. **1**. Co Rd 18 Box Culvert: floor and footings have been poured and they are working on the walls. **2**. Co Rd 30 Slope Failure: still waiting on Martin Marietta for approval. **3**. Co Rd 32 Dam Failure: still waiting on DNR for approval. **4**. Co Rd 34 Reconstruction: crew is working when weather allows and have started to place the 3" rock base on slopes. **5**. Co Rd 40 Bridge: waiting to do dirt work. **6**. Night Sign Inspection: waiting to discuss with Co Attorney a contract for an individual that will assist sign technician.

Claims were received and reviewed, following which it was moved by Kruger and seconded by Andreasen that the claims listed at end of these minutes be allowed and Clerk ordered to issue warrants on the various funds for the same. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Jared Schleifer, Weitz Construction, provided update to the Washington Co Justice Center. Schleifer stated that water issues have been addressed and they have now been pouring concrete and started installing footings. Schleifer also stated that although there was extra work being done to resolve the water issue and weather delays, it is covered under the Guarantee Maximum Price for Construction. Moving forward they will be working west to east and wall forms will be constructed soon. Kruger asked who oversees or inspects soil temperatures to which Schleifer said Terracon was on site daily during the excavation process to give approval on bearing compacity. Curt Field, Prochaska & Assoc, spoke and clarified that dewatering was included in the original plan.

Dan Douglas, Emergency Manager, discussed the purchasing of an ID badge printer to work with State Credentialing system. Douglas also explained how it would be utilized by other entities in Washington Co to include emergency responders in the City of Blair, villages and townships. Douglas then went on to discussed establishing fees for the non-county government entities to have ID badges via Co printer. Douglas said that he doesn't feel fees should be established and only address those entities who may be abusing the system. Motion Anderson second Kramer to not charge a fee to the other government entities and to refer to the proper committee or Chairman if system is abused. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Mike Smith provided a brief update of his duties and reviewed the annual reports he sends to the Nebr Weed Control Assoc and the Nebr Dept of Ag. Mike Anderson asked who in the County would certify hay to which Smith said he does. Motion Kramer

second Frahm to authorize Chairman to sign annual Weed Dept reports. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Toby Samuelson discussed his request to have Co Board deed to him Tax Lot 163 (parcel #890013244) via Treasurer's deed. Samuelson passed out packets to Board members detailing the parcel and explained that the narrow strip of land was an abandoned railroad that borders the back of his property. Board discussed options and process with Co Attorney. It was moved by Anderson and seconded by Kramer to table request to deed TL 163 to Toby Samuelson pending discussion with Co Atty and Treasurer. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Jail Committee: Anderson discussed Weitz Construction request for higher limits of coverage. Anderson stated that it may be a better savings to get additional coverage thru NIRMA. It was moved by Anderson and second Andreasen to have County get bid from NIRMA for higher limits of coverage. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Chairman read through Special Designated License: Rise's Drive-In Liquor, Inc., Reception at Rybin Building, Washington Co Fairgrounds, Arlington, 3/30/19, 1 PM to 1 AM. Motion Kruger second Anderson to authorize Chairman to sign SDL Local Recommendation Form. Vote- Aye: Rishel, Kramer, Frahm, Dethlefs, Andreasen, Anderson, Kruger. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Comments from Public: There were no public comments

Committee Reports: Anderson stated that the Jail Comm talked about a required inspection performed by HAZMAT for the Justice Center and discussed possibly getting the inspection to include the existing Courthouse. The inspection for the Justice Center is already included in the cost of the project, however it may be beneficial to get a quote that would include the whole Courthouse. Kramer stated that they would look into seeing if an inspection like that was done at the time of the Annex Construction project.

Kramer said Road Comm recommends a Public Meeting to discuss the 1&6 Year Plan be scheduled on Feb 12 at 7 p.m.

Kramer stated Tech Comm is going to review applicants for the System Admin position and give recommendations to Personnel Comm for interviews.
