The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 3:05 p.m. on April 13, 2021 in the Conference meeting room at the Public Library in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgement of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice of the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

7.1. Request approval to reduce retainage on Justice Center project from 5% to 2.5%. D/PA

Kramer stated that the Jail Comm as well as Bill Huey of Prochaska recommend approval of reducing the retainage. Schleifer answered questions from board and stated that it is common practice when projects reach a certain point of completion.

Kramer stated that some hinges have been damaged by inmates and that there are a couple of options for door stops to prevent future damage. Kramer said that the Jail Comm reviewed options and recommends the purchase of a single floor door stop to be used as a trial run for \$375 before placing order for all doors. Board discussed options at length. Sheriff Robinson and Mike Anderson spoke on the matter.

RESOLUTION 2021-10

WHEREAS, on March 10, the United States Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act, and

WHEREAS, part of this Act includes State and Local Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Funds legislation, which specifically allocates \$65.1 billion in direct aid to every county in America, and

WHEREAS, President Biden signed this legislation into law on March 11, 2021, and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties (NACo) was instrumental in making sure that counties were provided for in this legislation, and

WHEREAS, the United States Treasury will make the counties' allocation in two halves with the first half to be within 60 days of the President's signature with the second half no sooner than 12 months after, and

WHEREAS, guidelines for the use of these funds will become known in the near future by the Federal Government, and

WHEREAS, the total estimated allocation (includes consolidated funds) to Washington County is \$4,051,682, and

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, the Washington County Board of Supervisors has been advised by the Nebraska State Auditor's office to establish the new fund of the COVID American Rescue Plan Fund as Fund #2580 and to direct the County Clerk to add the newly create COVID American Rescue Plan Fund in the Washington County 2021/2022 Budget.
